#### Sunday's Gospel

On Sunday, we enter into the heart of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. In the Gospel he begins to offer the reinterpretation of the Torah (Law) of Moses that is so central to the presentation of him in the Gospel of Matthew.

Jesus continued to instruct the disciples in the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven. The readings on Sunday focus our attention on the nature of true wisdom. It is this true wisdom which prompts us to choose the right course of action. It is true wisdom that directs us in our interpretation of the law. It is in Christ we trust.

Looking back, what draws all these pronouncements of Jesus together is a sense of human life as essentially relational: it flourishes where respect, faithfulness, and consideration of the other prevail.

#### **Lifted Live Concert 2020**

The students were given a greater sense of Diocesan identity through FIAT (Faith in action) and were inspired by the inner dialogue and sharing that took place between schools. Another highlight of the day was being lifted in song and dance by Australian Artist Genevieve Bryant.

#### Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, 26th February marks the beginning of Lent. The tradition of marking the forehead with ash on Ash Wednesday can be traced back to the ancient Jewish action of dusting oneself with ash as a sign of repentance and mourning for wrongful actions. It was a



public declaration of the acknowledgement of the wrong and the commitment to turn one's life around and try not to make the same mistake again. It still remains a public declaration that during the period of Lent those who wear the cross of ash are going to attempt to turn around their lives and re-focus themselves more fully on God.

#### **North Rocks Rugby Union**





#### **NSW PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE**









All St Oliver's children participate in the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge. The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading and to enable students to experience quality literature.

The Challenge officially opens on March 2nd, but children may start reading now and recording their books on a piece of paper. The Student Reading Records will be distributed as soon as they are available. To complete the Challenge students must read a certain number of books that are on the PRC List. There are many hundreds of books on the list, many of which are available in our Library.
