Gospel

Jn 15:1-8

Jesus the vine, the Father, the vinegrower.

Cf. Jn 15:1.5

I am the true vine and you are the branches, says the Lord. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, bears fruit in plenty, alleluia.

The imagery that Jesus used in his parables and in extended metaphors such as the one used in this week's gospel sometimes seems a little foreign to a 21st century audience. However, the world in which Jesus lived and taught was dominated by small scale farmers and producers in an agrarian economy. His use of images such as 'shepherd', 'vine', 'tenants', 'farmers' and 'wineskins' would all have been immediately recognisable to his audience. They would also have appreciated much more than we do the subtlety of Jesus' use of such images when he twists them in an unexpected way.

Focus On Learning



Every day children go home and tell their parents what happened at school that day. It might be something that happened in class or on the playground. Sometimes they might be in tears and upset about what happened. You yourself might feel indignant on behalf of your child and want to march up to the school to 'sort it out'. It's important to remember that children have an egocentric view of the world. They see the world only from their perspective. We must remember that there are always two sides to every story and your child's telling of the story/situation may be skewed to "their version" of the incident.

- If you are concerned about something that your child tells you, you should approach your child's teacher **first** to discuss the issue. Often a simple conversation with the teacher will put an end to the situation.
- Don't discuss issues with other parents- this may lead to gossiping which can have detrimental effects on teachers and children- especially if you don't have all the facts.
- Never approach another parent or child about an issue- let the school know and we will deal with it.
- Trust in your school and your child's teachers. We are here to educate your child and always have the best interest of every student in mind.
- Encourage your child to be resilient, to bounce back from things and move on.
