This week and next Year 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN testing along with students across Australia. All NAPLAN testing will be completed online with the exception of the Year 3 Writing which will be pencil and paper. Students will complete four tests: Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy (in this order). NAPLAN tests are one aspect of each school's assessment and reporting process, and do not replace the extensive, ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance. We wish all our Year 3 and 5 students the best of luck as they complete their NAPLAN testing.


### **MOVING FORWARDS WITH THE PRC!**
